Tri-State Food Bank marked a milestone last year as it celebrated its 40th year of being a beacon of light for our neighbors facing hunger. From its grassroots beginning in 1982, we have grown to supply food to over 300 partnering agencies, organizations, and schools throughout the Tri-State, operating out of a 80,000-square-foot facility in Evansville. This progress would not have been possible without the tremendous support of our community and the selfless generosity of donors like you.

Over the past few years, the spike in inflation led to a sharp increase in the number of individuals and families struggling to make ends meet. As a result, more and more of our neighbors are faced with the hardship of hunger and have turned to us for help. With ever-increasing food prices, the cost for food banks to operate hunger-relief programs has also increased. But as we strive for everyone in our community to have access to the food they need to thrive, we must forge ahead with our progress.

2022 IMPACT REPORT

In 2022, your financial support helped launch a new program — Operation Full Pack — to provide monthly boxes of supplement food to our veterans and their households.



It helped establish our new Senior Grocery Program to help low-income senior citizens meet their nutritional needs. And it allowed us to expand the Weekend BackPack Program to provide bags of nutritious food to over 4,500 children facing hunger to help them through the weekends.

Over 14 MILLION POUNDS of food were distributed to our Tri-State neighbors facing hunger!



Over 3,500 low-income senior citizens in the Tri-State received monthly packages of supplemental food to help them make ends meet. In collaboration with 50 of our partnering senior service agencies, we provided over 1.4 million meals through the **Commodity Supplemental** Food Program, and nearly 136,000 meals through our new Senior Grocery Program.

Approximately 30,000 supplemental food boxes were distributed at over 200 Mobile **Food Distributions throughout** 2022. This program focuses on feeding people in underserved areas throughout our Tri-State service area, in partnership with churches and other local service agencies.

Over 4,500 Tri-State children who face hunger received weekly supplemental food through our Weekend BackPack Program. This amounted to over 50,000 bags of food that helped ensure these children had access to proper nutrition to get them through the weekend, and back to school ready to learn on Monday mornings.

We celebrated a special milestone in 2022, as it marked our 40th year of supplying emergency supplemental food for our Tri-State neighbors in need. In 1982, a forward-thinking group of people used a borrowed pickup truck to serve 7 non-profit agencies in Evansville. From that grassroots beginning, Tri-State Food Bank has experienced incredible growth, which allows us to better serve the most vulnerable populations who face the hardships of hunger. We now operate out of an 80,000-square-foot facility in Evansville, and use a fleet of four refrigerated trucks to supply food to over 300 partnering agencies, organizations, and schools throughout the 33 Tri-State counties we serve.

EXPANSION OF OPERATION FULL PACK

Launched locally in 2022, **Operation Full Pack provides** monthly food boxes for lowincome veterans, active military and their households through our partnership with military-serving organizations. Operation Full Pack is currently established in 3 of our counties, offering relief to hundreds of deserving veterans. EXPANSION OF SENIOR GROCERY PROGRAM

As we receive the necessary funding, we will expand the Senior Grocery Program throughout our service area in IN, IL, and KY. Through this crucial service, we seek to improve the health of our low-income elderly population by supplementing their diets with nutritious foods. We currently provide over 1000 grocery bags per month, packed with food that includes fresh fruits and vegetables, protein items such as canned chicken and tuna, peanut butter, canned beans, oats, rice, pasta, soup, and milk. We partner with 10 senior service agencies who offer our Senior Grocery Program, and look forward to developing more collaborations as it expands.
